FREE TEXT: This study explores the complex interrelationship between the family, child work and migration, the role of the family in decision-making and migration process and the economic benefits of labor migration for the child's family.

The study is based on interviews with 50 children below 18 years of age, who migrated from the provinces to Metro Manila, the capital city of the Philippines, to work as waged domestic workers. Most respondents felt that it was imperative for them to work and contribute to family income. Migrants tend to go to areas and occupations where other kin or community members have gone; family-based contacts in the recruitment process serve to make the migration process less risky. When asked what they think the government and the society can do for them, the children identified four priorities: higher wages and more benefits, protection from abusive employers, appropriate education programmes and a change in society's low regard for domestic workers.

FREE TEXT: This report provides an awareness of the realities and perspectives among migrant children, youth and their communities, as a means of building respect and partnerships to address their vulnerabilities to exploitation and abusive environments. The needs and concerns of migrants along the borders of China, Myanmar and Thailand are highlighted and recommendations to address these are made. The main findings of

the research include: (1) most impacted by migration are the people along mountainous border areas between China, Myanmar and Thailand, who represent a variety of ethnic groups; (2) both the countries of origin and countries of destination found that those migrating are largely young people and often include children; (3) there is little awareness to young migrants' concerns and needs, with extremely few interventions undertaken to reach out to them.

FREE TEXT: This paper considers three groups of children affected by international migration: (i) children left behind by international labour migrants from the Philippines, Indonesia, and Thailand; (ii) children of Thai nationals in Japan; and (iii) children brought along by irregular migrants in Malaysia and Thailand. Based on the limited data available from published sources, the paper constructs preliminary estimates of numbers of children involved. It then synthesizes available evidence on problems and opportunities faced by the children, and on policies towards them. There are, however, important gaps

in the available evidence. The paper identifies these gaps, and suggests ways in which they might be filled. The paper also makes policy recommendations.

The growth of international migration in Southeast Asia has affected significant numbers of children. Some necessarily crude calculations suggest that 3-6 million children have been left behind by Filipino parents working overseas; the equivalent figure for Indonesia is something like one million, and for Thailand half a million. These numbers imply that roughly 10-20 per cent of Filipino children, and 2-3 per cent of Indonesian and Thai children, have a parent overseas.

Based on good evidence from the Philippines, and scattered evidence from Indonesia and Thailand, it appears that (i) migration of parents improves the material conditions of the children left behind, which probably flows through to children's health and schooling, and (ii) the social costs are strongly mitigated by the involvement of the extended family. In the Philippines, but less so in Indonesia and Thailand, governmental and non-governmental organizations already provide a range of services for children and migrants.

FREE TEXT: In the 1970s and beginning of the 1980s, there was a great flow of migration from the rural areas of Peru to the capital city of Lima. This study focuses on the hardships and hopes, the worries and the dreams of the teenage daughters of these migrants. There is an especially strong focus on the interaction between daughters and their parents.

When the migrants came to Lima, they came with a dream: they wanted to build a future for themselves and their families that would offer a better life than the one that awaited them en la provincia. It is this dream that continues to form the cognitive and emotional backdrop of the messages that presents try to convey to their daughters. The girls themselves have embraced their parents' dream as their very own. There are, however, a myriad of factors that prevent its fulfillment.

The present study is devoted to examining both the component parts of the dream and those factors-psychological, social, economic -that all too often impede its realization.

FREE TEXT: In the Philippines, large-scale overseas migration raised concerns about left-behind children, who are perceived to be most affected by the absence of fathers, mothers or both. Without their 'real parents' (especially mothers) to rear and guide them, left behind children are perceived to bear the brunt of the social costs of migration.

Based on data collected from a 2003 nationwide study, this article examines how left-behind children (specially those aged 10-12 years old and adolescents) cope without their migrant parents. Three questions are explored: (1) how children are raised in the absence of one or both migrant parents; (2) how children (re) configure family, family life and family practices; and (3) what roles children have, if any, in how the family unit copes with the migration of one or both parents. Although migration creates emotional displacement for migrants and their children, it also opens up possibilities for children's agency and independence.

FREE TEXT: This research was undertaken by the Scalabrini Migration Center (SMC), the Episcopal Commission for the Pastoral Care of Migrants and Itinerant People, the Apostoleshship of the Sea-Manila and OWWA. Interviewed for the study were a total of 1,443 children of both non-migrant and migrant "intact" parents form different schools nationwide.

The research showed that young children of OFWs belonging to "intact" two-parent families "appear to be managing well for now" although the respondents were only

between 10 and 12 years old. Technology, such as the use of mobile phones, has also helped in maintaining a feeling of solidarity among family members across the miles, the study further revealed.

The study said that the absence of one or both parents leaves an emotional mark on the young children, especially when their mothers are away. However, contrary to popular belief, the study found that despite the emotion displacement, children of migrant parents are not disadvantaged compared to children of non-migrants in many aspects of well-being.

FREE TEXT: This study was conducted to provide a clearer picture on the conditions of Burmese child labourers working in Mae Sot District of Thailand's Tak Province situated next to the Thai-Burma border. Questions focused on the children's background and origin, education, family data, their living/housing arrangements, type of work and workplaces, wages, benefits, conditions of work, process of migration and recruitment into the workplace, including rationales for traveling to Mae Sot, and information on relative knowledge about human trafficking.

A total of 313 child migrant workers were interviewed, revealing information on what are arguably the worst forms of child labour occurring in Mae Sot. It is hoped that this study will help guide interventions for international and national organizations to improve the lives of these children, and mitigate or end the abuses to which they are being subjected. The study also indicates the key changes to law and policy in Thailand and its implementation in order to ensure migrant children of legal working age (e.g. 15 years+) can adequately access their basic labour rights.

FREE TEXT: This study uses data from Demographic and Health Surveys of 17 countries to assess the impact of maternal rural-urban migration on the survival chances of children under age two in the late 1970s and 1980s. Results show that, before migration, children of migrant women had similar or slightly higher mortality risks than children of women who remained in the village. In the two- year period surrounding their mother's migration, their chances of dying increased sharply as a result of accompanying their mothers or being left behind, to levels well above those of rural and urban non-migrant children.

The study concludes that many disadvantaged urban children would probably have been much worse off had their mothers remained in the village, and that millions of children's lives may have been saved in the 1980s as a result of mothers moving to urban areas.

The study looked into the experiences of these girls at various stages of the trafficking process: recruitment/migration, employment, moving out/rescue, and rehabilitation / reintegration.

The study recommends the conduct of community-based information campaign towards providing informed choices to parents and children. It calls for the activation of BCPCs to coordinate trafficking prevention activities; provision of incentives to poor parents who send their children to school; requiring barangay clearance to recruit; monitoring of exit and entry points commonly used in child trafficking operations; strengthening of the rescue and labor inspection programs. The study also recommends for the establishment of a legal protection center for working children; the improvement of services of government-run temporary shelters; and formulation of a comprehensive program framework for the problem of child trafficking.
